Session Descriptions

Donna Mulzet Beech, President, Delaware MTA, will present Piano Music of Ann Wyeth McCoy (1915-2006) Book Two: Of Paintings and a Sculpture. This lecture-recital/slide-presentation combines music and art, with allusions to poetry and mythology. The focus is Ann Wyeth McCoy's piano repertoire that is inspired by paintings done by family members – father N. C. Wyeth, brother Andrew Wyeth, son Jamie Wyeth, sister Henriette Wyeth, and husband John W. McCoy. View famous paintings that are housed in museums across the country, and hear Ann's musical interpretation of each. Learn more about this highly creative, perceptive, intuitive, sensitive family of artists.

Kate Beever, Board Certified Music Therapist at Maine Music & Health, will present Mapping the Impact of Music on Neurologic Processes. In this session, participants will gain new insights into the mechanisms of music processing in the brain and experience music interventions that can be easily translated into engagement opportunities for students of all ability levels. We'll discuss ongoing research initiatives in music and medicine and learn how these can be incorporated into funding requests for educational music programs.

MaineMTA members, **George Lopez** and **Gulimina Mahamuti** will present The Art of "Tone Painting" in Duo Piano Music. Inspired by the kaleidoscope of cultural diversity forecasting their tours of China, Brazil, and Italy this summer, Duo Mundi George & Guli explore piano literature with rich sonorities, evocative imageries, and aesthetic ideas through international gems of duo piano repertoire.

George Lopez, the Artist in Residence and Director of the Symphony Orchestra at Bowdoin College and faculty member Dr. Gulimina Mahamuti will lead you through a sonorous garden of tone painting inspired by music of Asia, Europe, Central and South America.

Bios of Conference Presenters



Donna Mulzet Beech received a Doctorate of Musical Arts degree in Piano Performance from The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., and bachelor's and master's degrees from West Chester University in West Chester, PA. She has performed as chamber musician, soloist, and collaborative pianist throughout the Mid-Atlantic and New England states.

Donna has been on the faculty of The Music School of Delaware since 1979 and has served on the faculty of Immaculata University in southeastern PA. In addition, she maintains an independent studio where she offers instruction in piano, music theory, and composition, and is active as an accompanist for professionals and students alike.

She serves as adjudicator for music associations along the Eastern Seaboard, served as Membership Chairperson for Pennsylvania MTA for eight years, and is currently President of Delaware State MTA. Past students have included finalists and semi-finalists in national and international competitions.

In 2017 she published the book *Piano Music of Ann Wyeth McCoy*, working in tandem with Ann's daughter Robin McCoy, and has since presented it in lecture-recital/slide-presentation format at museums, schools and teacher organizations in PA, NJ, DE, and Maine. It was revised and reprinted in 2023.

In early 2020 she completed a second book of Ann Wyeth McCoy's piano music, *Of Paintings and a Sculpture*, with input from Ann's daughter Anna B. McCoy, which she has presented for annual conferences for Delaware State MTA, Pennsylvania MTA, and local associations in New Jersey and Maine. Most recently she recorded a CD of all twenty-eight compositions, on Steinway Spirio pianos in Wilmington, Delaware, and Philadelphia, PA.

Donna has been Music Director at Lower Brandywine Presbyterian Church since 1987, and serves as one of the organists for St. Joseph on the Brandywine Catholic Church, both in Wilmington, DE. In 2008 Donna established the Jonathan Beech Memorial Concert, an annual benefit in memory of her older son who died of a brain tumor in 2007 at the age of fifteen; to date the concerts have raised over \$162,000 for organizations that help families who deal with pediatric cancer. She lives in Kennett Square, PA, with her husband Martin.

Maine Music & Health helps those with illnesses and disabilities reach their goals through the power of music. Kate's business was the SBA's 2017 Microenterprise of the Year and won \$10,000 from Robert Herjavec in the INC Magazine and UPS Store's Small Business Challenge in Los Angeles. MM&H has developed music & wellness programs with Maine Medical Center, York Hospital, the Dempsey Center, Boston College, the Portland and Bangor Symphony Orchestras, and worked with thousands of clients with medical needs.

Kate presents at conferences and facilitates group and individual sessions. She is also a trained REMO HealthRhythms facilitator and has her certification in Neurologic Music Therapy. Kate founded the Maine State Music Therapy Task Force, served as President of the USM Alumni Council and served on the APHA's Noise & Health committee. She teaches part time in Boston at Berklee College of Music in the music therapy department. Kate keeps an active schedule performing as a percussionist, spending time with family, paddling, and advocating for environmental health.

DUO MUNDI GEORGE & GULI captivates global audiences with their exciting, innovative, and diverse programming style. Lauded for their performances that "...breathe the same artistic air...with an adrenaline of communication that captivates audiences of every generation," the duo creates beautifully synchronized performances that engage both the eye and ear in a dance of emotions. Since their inception in 2022, DUO MUNDI G&G has performed standing-room-only concerts in venues across the globe. This summer, they embarked on an exhilarating tour through Mexico, China, Brazil, and Italy, where they were featured on Italian national TV,



RAI2. They are set to continue this momentum with upcoming concert and masterclass engagements in Switzerland and Spain. Their New York City debut at the Steinway Hall in April 2023 was a landmark event in their career. Since then, DUO MUNDI G&G has become a fixture on the New York music scene, performing at premier venues like The Oculus at One World Trade Center, The Village Trip Festival, and Third Street Settlement Music School, Recently, they performed a groundbreaking Spiriocast that connected live audiences from Boston virtually to Philadelphia. On the West Coast, they left a lasting impression with their debut at Santa Barbara's historic Lobero Theater and enthralled audiences in the greater Seattle area and Mexico's Baja California. The duo's extraordinary talents have also been showcased on radio broadcasts, most notably during a live interview and performance on All Classical Portland's "Thursdays @ Three" in Oregon. Their influence extends to universities, conservatories, and music organizations across the U.S. and abroad through their masterclasses and lectures. Their recent Global Outreach Initiative in Belize inspired over 800 schoolchildren. They've also enriched international and national conferences, including the MTNA, NCKP, and EPTA (in Portugal) Conferences and the Southeast Asia Piano Teachers Symposium. This fall, DUO MUNDI G&G will launch a two-day *Klavierfest* on AI's impact on music at Bowdoin College, Maine. As they continue to explore musical frontiers, DUO MUNDI GEORGE & GULI are set to make an indelible mark on classical music.

▼ eorge Lopez is the Artist in Residence and Symphony Orchestra Artist Director and Conductor at Bowdoin College in Maine. Renowned for his "kaleidoscopic colors and clarity of conception" (Los Angeles Times), he is celebrated for his sophisticated and artfully curated interpretations. His debut at the Concertgebouw in Amsterdam was described as "authentic and memorable" by the Nederlands Dagblad for his masterful performances of Bach's Goldberg Variations and Chopin's Preludes. Lopez's extensive repertoire is both broad and deep, encompassing the complete sonatas of Mozart, piano concertos of Beethoven, all Etude-Tableaux of Rachmaninoff, all Etudes and Ballades of Chopin, and recently the entire four-volume set of Bach's Klavierübungen, performed on organ, harpsichord, and piano. His performances have captivated audiences around the world, including Europe, Latin America, Asia, Australia, and throughout the United States, with appearances at esteemed venues such as Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, Merkin Hall, Benaroya Hall in Seattle, and Ambassador Hall in Los Angeles. Lopez has been a featured artist at numerous international music festivals, including the Girona International Festival of Music in Spain, the Kowmung Festival in Sydney, Australia, the Festivale d'Internazionale Solisti e Musica da Camera in Umbria, Italy, and the Latin American music festival Cubadisco in Havana, Cuba. As a guest soloist, he has performed with the National Symphony of São Paolo in Brazil, the Prague Chamber Orchestra, and in distinguished halls like Salle Cortot in Paris, Rose Hall in Osaka, and Asahi Hall in Tokyo. In addition to his solo career, Lopez collaborates in recording and outreach projects with members of the New York Philharmonic, Chicago Symphony, Boston Symphony, The Met Orchestra, San Francisco Symphony, Seattle Symphony, and The New World Symphony. He holds the First Prize for the Diplome Superieure from the Ecole Normale de Musique in Paris and the distinguished Uitvoerend Musicus degree from the Sweelinck Conservatorium in Amsterdam. As the artistic director and conductor of the Bowdoin College Symphony Orchestra, Lopez leads one of the most dynamic all-student symphonic programs in the New England region, fostering a vibrant musical community and inspiring the next generation of musicians.

ulimina Mahamuti is the first Uyghur from China to receive a Doctorate of Musical Arts in Piano Performance from the United States, where she studied at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. Her early admission at age 15 as a gifted high school piano major to Northwest University for Nationalities in China marked the beginning of a distinguished career. Dr. Mahamuti holds two Master of Music degrees, one in Piano Performance and Pedagogy from Harbin Normal University School of Music, and the other in Piano Performance from Pittsburg State University, where she graduated with the highest distinction, the Graduate Dean Academic Honors. Dr. Mahamuti's journey as a concert planist has been featured in various Chinese newspapers and television programs, culminating in a two-part documentary titled "Conversations with Dr. Gulimina Mahamuti" that aired on Karamay City's Public Television Network. Her life story was the subject of a Chinese documentary on the Gansu Province Public Television Network. Dr. Mahamuti made her Carnegie Hall debut in New York City at Weill Recital Hall, and her international performances have taken her to prestigious venues in Montreal, Copenhagen, Istanbul, and Budapest (at the invitation of the Turkish Ambassador), as well as across the United States and China. As a soloist, she performed piano concerti with the Southeast Kansas Symphony Orchestra, the Mansfield Symphony Orchestra, and the Harbin Philharmonic Symphony Orchestra. Her music has also been featured on radio programs such as San Francisco's classical music stations, Queens College/CUNY podcast, China Touch Radio, and Istanbul Technical University Radio. In addition to her performance career, Dr. Mahamuti is a dedicated educator currently teaching at Bowdoin College. She has previously held teaching positions at Ohio Wesleyan University, Capital University, and the School of Music of Northwest University for Nationalities in China. She published articles in Clavier Companion and released a CD titled Xinjiang Piano Music from Western China, highlighting her commitment to promoting diverse musical traditions. A twoterm member of the MTNA Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee, Dr. Mahamuti organized the Pedagogy Saturday's DEI Track at the 2024 National Conference in Atlanta. She recently accepted the nomination as the 2025-2027 Vice President of the MTNA DEI Committee, where she will continue to advocate for inclusive practices in music education and performance.
